Camp Danison

September the 2^{4th} A. D. 1862

Dear Brother I sit myself

down to write you a few lines
to let you know I am well and
hoping these few lines may find
you enjoying the same.

Well George we had a fine rain
last night which laid the
dust and made the camp
more pleasant for drilling.

We went out on drill this
morning. I would rather
do it than to be in camp.
Yesterday I came across Harvill
Willy. & James Daniel. & Purdy
here in camp. Willy looked
to jump out of his boots
he was glad to see the boys

of Morgan - Wiley is going to
the Regt with us if he gets
his transportation which
Capt Rainey says he may will
A. W. Stewart & Mast. Davis
was here by 4 o'clock last
evening and we got
your letters & was glad
to hear from you at
home. Well we will not
I dont think leave here
before the first of next week
we will get our clothing
in a day or two

Tell pap to make F. W. Kyles
walk up to the mack
for he will stand back
as long as he can

Tell all of the folks at
home that we will do
(as the Irish say) the right
things. Tell them all to
wait. Tell John to
attend to the girls till
I come back no
more at present
for I must stop
the mail goes out
in a little bit
