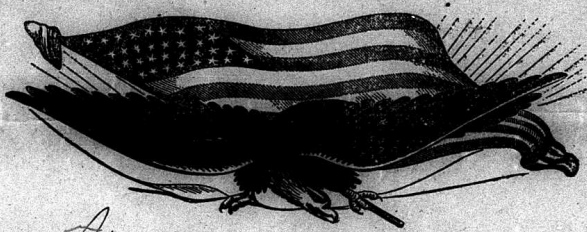

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN.



Know Ye, That George W. Cousins Private
 of Captain C. Cousins (B) Company, 43^d Regt.
 Battalion, "OHIO NATIONAL GUARD," aged 28 years, and residing
 in Wm. Morgan County, Ohio, having joined
 said organization on the 15th day of July A. D. 1865
 to serve for the term of **FIVE YEARS**, and having served with his company,
 honestly and faithfully to the present date, is now **HONORABLY DISCHARGED**
 from the military service of the State of Ohio, by virtue of an act of the
 General Assembly, passed April 2d, A. D. 1866, entitled "an
 act to enroll the Militia of Ohio, to organize a volunteer militia, and
 to repeal certain acts therein named;" the tenth section of which act requires
 the honorable discharge of all members of the "**National Guard.**"

That said _____ having been mustered
 into the U. S. Service in May, 1864, under the call for "one
 hundred day" men, and honorably discharged therefrom, is exempt from
 militia duty excepting in case of war, insurrection, or invasion, or the reason-
 able apprehension thereof.
